

Women's Regional, Rural and Remote Diversity Scholarships 2022

FAQs

About the program

The Australian Institute of Company Directors (AICD) with support from the Department of the Prime Minister and Cabinet's Office for Women is pleased to launch a multi-year scholarship program to support emerging and experienced female directors in regional, rural and remote Australia.

The program aims to provide governance education opportunities for suitably qualified women who face additional barriers to leadership participation.

The AICD welcomes applicants who reflect the diversity of Australia's population and encourages Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander women, culturally diverse women, women with disability and those in the not-for-profit sector to apply.

What does the scholarship include?

The first round of the program is offering the following courses to be undertaken in 2022:

- 30 full-fee scholarships to undertake the AICD's [Company Directors Course](#)
- 24 full-fee scholarships to undertake the AICD's [Foundations of Directorship](#) program.

Each scholarship includes subsidised travel and accommodation* to the course location, a one-year membership to the AICD and a subscription to the AICD's Directorship Opportunities service. Options to attend courses online are also available.

Applicants should apply for either the Foundations of Directorship program or the Company Directors Course, depending on their level of directorship experience.

*travel and accommodation must be paid for by the individual. Claims capped at \$1100 or \$1500, commensurate with course and individual travel requirements, may be submitted for reimbursement on completion of the course.

What are the application dates?

Applications open Tuesday 5 October 2021 and close at **5pm AEDT Friday 29 October 2021**.

What are the eligibility requirements?

This scholarship is open to executive women and emerging female directors residing in regional, rural and remote Australia. To be eligible you must:

- Identify as a woman;
- Live outside a main Australian metropolitan city or urban area. To check if your area is eligible, please click [here](#) (if your postcode falls into the 'Regional centres and other regional areas category' then you are eligible for this scholarship).
- Currently have the right to remain in Australia to work and study for a period of at least five years (you will be required to show proof of visa status);
- Have never been, nor are you currently, disqualified from being a director of a corporation or organisation; and
- Agree to course time and deadline commitments and be able to provide own transport and travel costs until reimbursement on completion of the course.

Which course should I choose?

It is generally expected that candidates applying for the **Foundations of Directorship** program should have gained the skills, qualifications and experience as a:

- Senior executive with at least 3 years' experience in Executive Management or reporting to Executive Management or the CEO;
- Key Management Person with at least 3 years' experience working in middle management or with employees reporting to them and responsible for budgets, P/L and the implementation of organisational goals and objectives;
- Private business owner or entrepreneur managing a significant private business; or
- Other experience and skills that demonstrate to a high degree the applicant's leadership potential and capacity within one of the designated sectors.

It is generally expected that candidates applying for the **Company Directors Course** should have gained the skills, qualifications and experience as a:

- Member of a board or committee (including listed, not for profit, private or government);
- Senior executive with at least 3 years' experience in Executive Management reporting to the board;
- Private business owner or entrepreneur managing a significant private business; or
- Other experience and skills that demonstrate to a high degree the applicant's leadership potential and capacity within one of the designated industries.

What will applicants be assessed on?

Applicants will be evaluated on the following criteria:

- Benefits to the candidate's professional development;

- Candidate's potential for leadership;
- Barriers to participation in leadership and education; and
- Financial literacy and directorship/executive experience.

The Selection Committee will also take into consideration candidates who:

- Are Indigenous or have culturally-diverse heritage;
- Live with disability;
- Are active in sectors where women are traditionally under-represented; and/or
- Identify financial circumstances that may otherwise preclude participation in the course.

The selection panel will consider an individual's reasons for applying for the scholarship and career aspirations, including benefits to the candidate's professional development.

What level of financial knowledge is required to undertake each course?

It is expected that candidates will have a sound level of financial literacy to undertake the requirements for successful completion of the Company Directors Course and final assessment.

For the Foundations of Directorship program, Finance for Directors is one of the programs covered.

Can I apply for this program if I have applied for previous AICD scholarship programs?

Yes, you will need to submit a new online application via the ASF website.

If my application is successful, can I select when and where to undertake the course?

Applicants are able to choose the course date from a range of dates provided in the application form. Courses can be taken face-to-face or online. For face-to-face courses, applicants should select their closest capital city.

Note that the AICD will aim to accommodate course preferences pending availability and travel restrictions.

Why is the scholarship only available to women?

This scholarship program is delivering governance education opportunities to women in regional and rural areas, with a view to providing assistance to under-represented groups in leadership and, in particular, women who face additional barriers to participation.

Women currently comprise only 33.7% of board positions and only 11% chair positions in the ASX 200. While these percentages are the highest they have ever been, the proportion of women directors on small listed company boards is even lower. There is still a long way to go before Australia achieves gender parity in corporate leadership.

According to the Diversity Council Australia's, [Capitalising on Culture](#) report, in each of the ASX 100, ASX 200 and ASX 500 listed companies, around a quarter of directors are from culturally diverse backgrounds, compared with a third in the wider community.

When will I be notified if I have been awarded a scholarship?

The announcement of program recipients will be in December 2021. You will be notified by the Australian Scholarships Foundation via email and contacted by a member of the Australian Institute of Company Directors shortly after to arrange your membership and course booking.

Can I send in an application in writing?

No, we can only accept applications that have been lodged online via the Australian Scholarship Foundations application portal.

How does the travel and accommodation subsidised reimbursement work?

Travel and accommodation must be paid for by the individual upfront. Claims will be subsidised at up to \$1,100 per Foundations of Directorship recipient and \$1,500 per Company Directors Course recipient. Once the individual has completed the program, they will need to submit a claims' form to the AICD with the relevant receipts attached.

What if I can no longer do the date I specified in the application?

The application will ask you to pick the most convenient date for the program you have selected to apply for. This date is not your confirmed date; successful recipients will be contacted by an AICD representative to confirm course dates. All recipients must undertake their awarded course in 2022 (consideration will only be given to extend this date on a case-by-case basis if individual circumstances necessitate).

Do I need to be a member of the AICD to apply?

No. The Women's Regional, Rural and Remote Diversity Scholarship is open to both members and non-members of the AICD. Each scholarship will include a one-year membership to the Australian Institute of Company Directors.

What type of referees should be provided?

You need to provide two referees who can verify the information you have provided in your application form. Ideally these will be individuals who have worked with you professionally and have current knowledge of your career history.

Will the AICD publish scholarship recipient names?

The Australian Institute of Company Directors and the Australian Government reserves the right to publish a complete list of scholarship recipients by full name and state or territory.
